He will still be in the area, so if


there is an emergency please reach out to him and let him know.

Theologian in Residence



John Pavlovitz is a writer, pastor, activist, and storyteller from Wake Forest, North Carolina. Over the past decade, his thought-provoking blog, *Stuff That Needs to Be Said*, has reached a diverse worldwide audience with over 100 million views. A 25-year veteran in the trenches of local church ministry, Pavlovitz is committed to equality, diversity, and justice—both inside and outside faith communities.

John's books include *A Bigger Table*, and *If God Is Love, Don't Be a Jerk*. His new book *Worth Fighting For*, will arrive on April 2. He currently directs Empathetic People Network, a vibrant online community that connects people from all over the world who want to create a more compassionate planet.

The Program

The first two Saturday sessions will be presented at Ames United Church of Christ, 217 Sixth St., Ames IA and also will be available via Zoom to those who register. John Pavlovitz will lead all three sessions. The third session will utilize a workshop format and will not be available by Zoom.

• **9:40-10:00 am. Meet and greet John Pavlovitz,** Fellowship Hall, Ames UCC church. This is an opportunity to meet John Pavlovitz. John must leave immediately following the worship service so he will not be available to greet worshippers then.

• **10:00-11:00 am. Worship Service at Ames UCC with John Pavlovitz providing the sermon.** Available in person or via Zoom.

Note: Parking is available in the public lot east of the church or along streets in the area. Meters take quarters. All those who register for the event will receive a Zoom link a few days before April 6. Please note that not all sessions are available via Zoom. There is no charge for registration.




