Lighting of the Advent Wreath

VOICE I: O God, we light the first candle of Advent. (light first candle)

VOICE 2: We kindle it with hope. We long for you to come to our world, to break through and reign with compassion, justice, and peace.

VOICE I: We remember times we longed for God to be present to us, this congregation, and this world. We recall...

(We pause while members of the congregation speak out times they prayed for hope).

VOICE 2: The prophet Isaiah also cried to God to tear open heaven and come down. He called God's people to do right. Isaiah called them to be refashioned like clay by God, the potter. This Advent, we call out to God.

ALL: Mighty God, creator of the world, break through all that keeps us from you. We ask for your mercy and reform us in your image. This Advent, visit us with your justice, love, and peace. Shine on us, O God of justice; Guide our path through gloom of night; Bear within us Wisdom's glory; Come to us, O Christ the Light. Amen.

"Learn this parable from the fig tree. After its branch becomes tender and it sprouts new leaves, you know that summer is near. In the same way, when you see all these things, you know that the Human One is near, at the door. I assure you that this generation won't pass away until all these things happen. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will certainly not pass away. "But nobody knows when that day or hour will come, not the heavenly angels and not the Son. Only the Father knows. As it was in the time of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Human One.In those days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark. 

- "... I've had a complicated relationship with religion. At times I fully embraced the idea of God, at others I completely rejected religion as mere delusion. I never seemed ambivalent about faith, but I always changed my mind as my moods coalesced into furious yet inspiring mixed episodes, episodes in which mania and depression occur together, that left me full of religiosity and wrestling with big questions and supernatural forces...
- ... We are an inquisitive and doubting bunch, so we'll always try to use our reason to settle such questions. But we're inclined toward spirituality as well. And for many, spirit transcends reason and leads to greater understanding. A mixed episode can take us there as well, or it can leave us dreadfully desperate. How we approach, make room for and hold the occurrence of private religious practice in the treatment of bipolar disorder, how we seek to ameliorate the aspects of bipolar disorder that make us suffer and uphold the aspects of bipolar disorder that reinforce us, can make all the difference in our ability to live meaningful lives of service and health." A note on our worship:

In Ankeny UCC, we encourage the Holy Spirit to flow in our service to all who are called to be in this place. As we get our feet under us in our return to in-person worship, we have changed some of our practices for the time being.

First, we have limited our sanctuary capacity somewhat, and we invite you and whoever you are worshiping with to space yourselves around our pews. Due to the ongoing pandemic, please wear a mask during the service.

Second, we are distributing communion on the way into the sanctuary, rather than circulating and serving communion during the liturgy. Know that no matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, the table is set for you. Likewise, we invite you to share any offerings you may have in the plates outside the doors to the sanctuary as you exit.

Third, we are holding off on a return to congregational singing during the service. We miss it, too!

Finally, it's not yet time to return to our indoor fellowship time, but invite you to socialize out of doors. Pastor Nathan would be delighted to see you there following the service.
